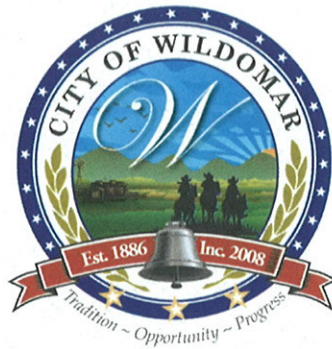

Frequently Asked Questions and Answers About Measure Z

Q: What is Measure Z?

A: On August 8, 2012, the Wildomar City Council unanimously placed Measure Z on the November 6, 2012 ballot. If approved, Measure Z would provide local funds for Wildomar community parks. Measure Z is an annual \$28 per parcel special tax. Wildomar has already closed two community parks. If approved, Measure Z would provide funding for Wildomar community parks as well as recreation services.

Q: What park and recreation services can Measure Z fund?

A: If approved, Measure Z may fund the repair, operation and maintenance of community parks and related facilities, programs and services, including:

- Maintaining safe playground equipment
- Maintaining clean public restrooms
- Restoring safety lighting
- Removing graffiti

Q: Can Measure Z fund youth services and recreation programs?

A: Yes, Measure Z can fund youth services and recreation programs.

Q: How much funding will go to parks?

A: All Measure Z funds will go toward funding Wildomar community parks. By law, Measure Z funds can only be used for Wildomar community parks and recreation programs.

Q: Can Sacramento take Measure Z money?

A: No, Measure Z legally requires that all funds be used within the City for parks and recreation programs.

Q: What are Measure Z's fiscal accountability protections?

A: Measure Z legally requires independent financial audits and citizens oversight to ensure that funds are spent properly.
