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**INDEMNIFICATION.** Permittee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless The City of Wildomar, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents from any and all actual or alleged claims, demands, causes of action, liability, loss, damage or injury to property or persons including wrongful death whether imposed by a court of law or by administrative action of any federal, state or local governmental body or agency arising out of an incident to any acts, omissions, negligence or willful misconduct of Permittee, its personnel, employees, agents, or contractors in connection with or arising out of the operation, construction, maintenance or repair of the work performed under this permit. This indemnification includes without limitation, by the payment of all penalties, fines, judgments, awards, decrees, attorney's fees, and related costs or expenses and the reimbursement of the City, its elected officials, officers, employees and/or agents for all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them. This indemnification excludes only such portion of any claim, demand, cause of action, liability, loss, damage, penalty, fine or injury to property or persons including wrongful death which is caused solely and exclusively by the gross negligence of willful misconduct of the City as determined by a court of administrative body of competent jurisdiction. Permittee's obligation to indemnify the City shall survive the expiration of termination of this Permit and shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the City, its elected officials, officers, employees or agents.

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### HAUL PERMIT GENERAL INFORMATION

1. A Haul Route Plan must be submitted with a Haul Route Application. A deviation from the plan requires approval from the City. (Any portion of the haul route that is located in any County or another City is subject to review and approval by that public agency.)
2. At least 24 hours before the hauling is to commence, the applicant shall notify the City: [pwpermits@cityofwildomar.org](mailto:pwpermits@cityofwildomar.org)
3. Tracking onto City streets is prohibited and shall be prevented at all times. The contractor shall be responsible for maintaining public right-of-ways used for hauling purposes in a condition free of dust, soils and debris. Haul vehicles will comply with the freeboard requirements of Section 23114 of the California Vehicle Code for both public and private roads.
4. The City reserves the right to limit the number of trucks and hours of operation depending upon the location of the project and impacts to traffic circulation.
5. Disposal of all waste and recycling materials removed as part of any grading project shall be in compliance with the City's Solid Waste Franchise Agreement.
6. The City may require that a security amount be submitted in cash, in a form immediately available to the City, to correct any deficiency or public safety hazard created by the hauling operation or in violation of the permit.
7. Tracking Controls per CASQA Standard TC-1, or equivalent, shall be installed on access road(s).
8. There must be 300 feet clear unobstructed sight distance to the intersection from both the public roadway and the access road. (If the sight distance cannot be obtained, flagmen shall be posted.)
9. Advance warning signs shall be posted on the public roadway per CA MUTCD, or equivalent, and shall be covered or removed when the access is not in use. Additional signs may be required depending on the site location.
10. A stop sign conforming to the requirements of the California Vehicle Code shall be posted at the entrance of the access road to the public roadway.
11. Any other traffic control measures deemed necessary which may include police officers, flagmen, signs, barricades, detours, etc.
